Attending: Eric Marczak, Amy Lauterbach, Brigitte McAuliffe (by phone), Dave Nelson Eric opened the meeting at 7:35 PM.

Housekeeping

- Eric moved to approve the October meeting minutes. Brigitte seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
- Dave Nelson was sworn in as a member of the CAC.
- Amy will send a link to Dave for online access to an annual harassment training program.
- Eric will reach out to a few young (16-20 years) people who may want to get involved in our work.

Education and Outreach

- Local outlets include the town's newsletter and website, Altamont Enterprise, and the Times Union, Daily Gazette.
 - o Eric will introduce Dave to Noah Zweifel.
- Ideas for activities:
 - Does AC S&WCD hold events to encourage/offer water testing, soil testing for the public?
 - o Invite wildlife handlers to bring a bald eagle or other wildlife.
 - o Eric can ask his indigenous friends to discuss uses of natural resources for medicine, basket weaving, etc.
 - Building bluebird houses Eric's Northeastern Woodworking Association contacts may have suggestions.
 - Develop lawn signs to encourage sustainable best practices, such as Niskayuna's pesticide pledge.
- Survey
 - Brigitte has been looking at Survey Monkey, would like to ask:
 - What people care about most, why they moved here or why they continue to live here, when they
 or their family settled here
 - Where they work/spend their days
 - Do they want change? What kind?
 - More business? A Dollar Store?
 - o Collect data to help determine need for tax revaluation, comprehensive plan update
 - Need to dispel misinformation, focus the public on efforts to protect priorities of majority
 - Communicate that karst and water quality are linked, that karst makes parts of Knox effectively a single source water supply

Map Library (for Open Space Inventory)

- This work has been on hold as we focus on getting the plank walkway and kiosk project done.
- Eric will look for companies that make maps.
- We need to identify maps we are missing from our inventory and available sources.
- We could use a large screen display to view maps on websites we can access at a future meeting.

<u>Critical Environmental Areas (CEAs)</u>

- This effort will follow the map inventory work.
- We will work to identify possible sources of pollution, sink holes, sensitive areas, etc.

Wetlands Boardwalk Restoration Project

- We still need to build a ramp at the start of the walkway. Ray will put the ridge cap on the kiosk very soon.
- Signs and interpretive materials need to be developed.

- Displays need to be attractive, easy to read. Dave sent us this link to USDA's US Forest Service website with examples of designs: https://www.fs.usda.gov/wildflowers/features/panels.shtml
 - o Include a QR code to link to more material on the town website
 - Need to determine what activities will be allowed and prohibited:
 - Fishing might be compatible
 - Kayaking/canoeing?
 - Camping?
 - Authority for hunting resides with the state we need to research applicable restrictions and what restrictions we would want to/could impose:
 - Feeding wildlife
- We'll ask Nelson to photograph the wetland again with his drone when the walkway is finished.
- We'll make a map showing where the beaver dam and other highlights are.
- We could develop a bird list for this site.
- Amy will arrange an inspection of the grant funded project with Susan Lewis of ACS&WCD.

Other Discussion

Dave's friend Jared has lived in Knox for a couple years. He does public programs about birds, works on NYS DEC's New York Breeding Bird Atlas for their Natural Heritage Program: https://www.dec.ny.gov/animals/29338.html.
