The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

RESOLUTION # 107 - APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion of Councilwoman Gage, seconded by Councilman Stevens, the following resolution was ADOPTEDAYES 5 NAYS 0

RESOLVED that the minutes of the October 2010 meeting be approved.

RESOLUTION #108 -SUSPEND REGULAR BOARD MEETING AT 7:31 P.M. FOR PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE TENTATIVE TOWN BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011

On motion of Councilman Stevens, seconded by Councilwoman Nagengast, the following resolution was ADOPTED AYES 5 NAYS 0

RESOLVED that the Town Board suspend regular board meeting for the Public Hearing on the tentative town budget for fiscal year 2011.

Supervisor Hammond read the legal notice advertised in the Altamont Enterprise for the public hearing on the tentative budget for 2011.

Councilman Stevens would like to reduce line item A1010.1, for town board personal services. He would like to donate a portion of his pay and add it to line item A7310.4 for youth programs. Supervisor Hammond stated the board has done a good job with this year's budget and suggested that Councilman Stevens write a letter to the town board, after the first of January proposing his decision.

Chasity McGivern presented the town board with an after school snow sports program on behalf of the Knox Youth Committee. Currently, Berne Knox Westerlo School does not participate in this after school program at Maple Ski Ridge. The Knox Youth Committee would like the town to sponsor this program, at no cost to the town and no liability on the town. Maple Ski Ridge needs fifteen children or adults to participate in this program, in which they will receive a \$110.00 discount. Town Attorney Dorfman reviewed the release and waiver of liability, and stated that it's not enforceable and not legal. After discussing this with the Ski School Liaison, Lynn Walkuski and Maple Ski Ridge's insurance company, the form will be modified and sent to Supervisor Hammond.

RESOLVED to approve payment of \$4,375.00 to Altamont Glass & Mirror Co., Inc. for the furnish and installation of the front door.

Supervisor Hammond presented the board with an Extended Warranty contract and a Customer Service Agreement for the Milton Cat Generator. The extended warranty, if purchased, will add another three years on top of the two year warranty received with the unit for a total of five years. The cost for the extended warranty is \$1,200.00 for a total of five years. The service agreement is \$699.00 for an annual agreement. Councilwoman Gage and Nagengast would like Town Attorney Dorfman to review.

Town Clerk Swain presented the Town Board with a Records Management Destruction Form #11-3-10. According to the New York State Record Retention and Disposition Schedule, those documents listed on the form are obsolete and are eligible for destruction.

Supervisor Hammond and Town Board members agreed on the next date to hold a workshop on the issues of the One-Cut Rule. Town Clerk to advertise the date of November 16th at 7:00p.m.
