

Knox Town Board Minutes March 10, 2020

T. Wolfe – suggested to the Board they pass a resolution to County Executive Daniel McCoy and possibly the Public Service Commission to request help to push National Grid along to provide electricity for the wireless service antenna site

B. McAuliffee-asked where the rule regarding time allotment may not be yielded to 3rd party came from. Supervisor Lefkaditis stated this was not a question and answer session. She asked the Clerk to provide her with the local law dictating third parties cannot be allocated the time.

E. Ackroyd – stated the Hometown Hero Banners will be taking place again this year. He would like to spread the word to all Veterans in the Town.

Consent Agenda:

RESOLUTION 062-2020 - A motion was made by Councilman Saddlemire seconded by Councilman Pritchard to approve the Meeting Minutes from 2.11.20 and 2.18.20. This motion carried unanimously.

<u>RESOLVED</u>: to approve the Meeting Minutes from 2.11.20 and 2.18.20. *The Workshop Minutes were removed from this vote as they were incomplete due to tape recorder failure. These minutes will be added to next months agenda.

Presentation:

Albany County Legislator Jeff Perlee from the 31st District spoke to the Board regarding the Coronavirus in Albany County. He stated he was briefed by the County Health Commissioner and stated the CDC and the Albany County Health Department web pages are very reliable sources for information regarding the virus. He stated each member of the legislature was granted a member item grant for senior transportation. Mr. Perlee has allocated his grant of \$300.00 to the Town of Knox. He sits on the Public Works Committee where he co-sponsored, and the Legislature approved, an allocation of \$121,000.00 to reconstruct Knox Cave Road. This will be 3.6 miles from Route 156 to Route 157A. This will also include upgrades to the storm water drainage system and guardrails. This project will commence sometime mid-summer and finish in early Autumn. Another grant was approved to study the extension of the Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail, which currently ends in Voorheesville. He proposed an extension of the rail trail to come up the hill and link with Thacher and Thompsons Lake State Park. He would like to bring to the Boards' and Public's attention regarding the Governors amendment to the state budget that will fundamentally change the way local towns can regulate solar and wind facilities. The proposal would affect the concept of Home Rule.

Supervisor Lefkaditis asked Legislator Perlee if now is the time to ask about removing the hump at the intersection of Knox Cave and Pleasant Valley Roads, before the reconstruction project begins, as it has been a troublesome intersection for accidents. Mr. Perlee said this is definitely the time and he would also help the Supervisor to reach out and help to address the issue.

Highway/Transfer Station:

Superintendent of Highways Schanz requested to attend Highway School in June 2020. The cost for lodging is \$252.00 and registration is \$110.00.

RESOLUTION 063-2020 - A motion was made by Councilman Cyr seconded by Councilman Pritchard to authorize an expenditure NTE \$400.00 for Superintendent Matt Schanz to attend Highway School Training. This motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent Schanz asked the Supervisor for an update on purchasing the motor from the County. He stated the Shared Service Agreement has been executed and has been sent to the County Highway Department who will then send it to County Executive McCoy. As soon as it is signed by Mr. McCoy the check for \$1.00 will be sent and then the motor can be picked up and put in.

Superintendent Schanz stated he has received a few bids to put the motor in. The lowest bid received was from Mr. Palmer. This discussion will continue at the next Board meeting pending the status of the motor from the County.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Planning Board Chair, Tom Wolfe was present, and the changes to the Home Occupation definition were discussed with his input.

The changes now read: In any district, except for LC1 and LC2 individuals may, with a special use permit from the Zoning Board of Appeals, conduct their business, trade or profession in their home or residence or accessory building, provided no more than 2 persons unrelated to the owners or residents are employed in addition to the owner, (as defined in section 50A-1A above) of the property; that no other professional shall be permitted share, let or sublet space or professional use. Let there be no external evidence of such use except one sign consisting of Article V Section 50C regulation and there shall be no visual exterior storage of material except equipment.

Amy also stated we need to inform them if we will be using their services to complete the project which was confirmed by Supervisor Lefkatits we have agreed not to.

-Amy requested the energy use data for 2019 (electric, propane, and fuel oil for heating) be updated and sent to her

-Amy stated the next steps for the grant need to be decided. A property will be discussed in executive session tonight and Supervisor Lefkaditis will be in touch regarding this.

Speed limit reduction on Crow Hill Road – granted to reduce speed limit to 40 MPH on Crow Hill Road. There is a 40 MPH on Crow Hill Road at Town Highway between CR 253 and the Schenectady-Albany County line, a distance of three tenths of one mile.

New Business:

Borrego PILOT update- the Attorney had a concern regarding the use of words "tax and jurisdictions". He recommends it either be defined or removed from the agreement. Supervisor Lefkaditis will work on correcting this issue and report back to the Board.

April Meeting Date changed – The April 2020 meeting will be will be moved from the second Tuesday in April to the first Tuesday in April.
